

Guidelines for Burnout Practice, Demonstrations and Competitions at Barbagallo Raceway Wanneroo

1. Each competitor and driver must complete an entry form and sign the exclusion of liability, release and assumption of risk disclaimer for competitors and or drivers.
2. The competitor and driver must have a CAMS Level 2 Non Speed Licence as a minimum at a cost of \$62. This licence is valid for 12 months from date of issue. The licence also entitles you to participate in drifting.
3. Minimum dress standard is clothing that extends from ankles to neck to wrists. Clothing and footwear of flammable synthetic material, such as nylon, is not acceptable. Drivers whenever on the burn out pad must wear a safety helmet (motocross helmet not acceptable).
4. Vehicles cannot be driven back to the paddock area unless the vehicle has four fully inflated tyres. Any deflated tyre must be replaced on the infield. If is preferable that the vehicle can be loaded on and off a trailer whilst on the infield.
5. The vehicle must have a minimum lap sash seat belt.
6. The driver must remain seated and the seat belt engaged whilst on the burn out pad.
7. No passengers are permitted.
8. A zero blood alcohol level is enforced for drivers and passengers.
9. A person with a fire extinguisher must be present at all times. Fire extinguishers can be provided by the Club and the cost of refill, repair or replacement is the responsibility of the hirer.
10. A person with a senior first aid certificate, first aid kit must be present at all times. A first aid kit can be provided by the Club and the cost of consumables, repair or replacement is the responsibility of the hirer.
11. An appropriately licensed CAMS Club Chief or Bronze level Clerk of Course must be in attendance with a mobile phone at all times.
12. All tyre debris at the conclusion of the Burnout activity must be removed from the pad and disposed of in a bin.
13. The disposal of fuel drums and tyres is the responsibility of the competitor. These items are not to be put in the bins at the Raceway and must be disposed of by the competitor outside the venue in a thoughtful manner and at the competitor's cost.
14. Only oil can be placed in the waste oil drums at the Raceway. Oil filters, coolant, brake and power steering fluids must be disposed of at the competitor's cost at a government approved collection centre. For further information see www.oilrecycling.gov.au
